

This work is the third part of a series of monologues: As a child, the protagonist Ursula Gärtner and her family were bought out of Romania by the Federal Republic of Germany in the early 1970s, 'without a receipt', without an option to return, disconnected from their own history. With what ideas of 'their future'?

In this work, life becomes the 'permanent theme'. Artificial intelligence calculates the future in the present from patterns of the past. Together with computer linguist Xenia Klinge, the protagonist enters into dialogue with simulations of herself from different decades. Today, 50 years in the future, the girl from back then speaks as an Al with her physical original about farewells and arrivals, freedom and foreignness. Memories and expectations are constructed and deconstructed, a biography is continued and rewritten.
